



I write to encourage the Alaska Seafood Marketing Institute (ASMI) take part in an Alaska Seafood Festival in Manila, Philippines. The idea for this festival was brought to my attention by Jenny Strickler, Honorary Consul to Alaska for the Republic of the Philippines. The festival would showcase the variety and high quality of Alaska ocean harvests and open a new market for Alaska seafood in the Philippines.

Currently, much of the Salmon in the Philippines is imported farmed salmon. A festival highlighting the superiority of Alaskan wild salmon could have a big impact on diners' choices there creating a new economic opportunity for Alaska fisheries. Guests would include seafood wholesalers, restaurateurs, food critics and other media representatives.

Greetings from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Foreign Agricultural Service in Manila!

Earlier this year we were honored to receive a delegation of Alaska State Representatives, which included Representative Cathy Munoz. During their visit we had the opportunity to brief them on the exploding market here for U.S. food and beverage products, including the fact that the Philippines is the largest f & b market in SE Asia, and larger than India and Brazil combined. We were so pleased to hear from Representative Munoz last week that she is planning to make a presentation to your group to encourage ASMI to undertake direct export opportunities in the Philippines, a key market in Southeast Asia and the 10<sup>th</sup> largest export market in the world for U.S. agricultural, fish and forestry products.
